





Team Ocean Kayak's Sam Rinando, Rick Spillman, Clint Barghi, and Cameron Barghi fished the first event for the Galveston Redfish Series. This event was a preliminary event and did not count towards the end of the year standings.

Sam and Rick connected on some nice redfish, on a day that had strong winds and heavy rains. Sam and Rick found a nice redfish, but were unable to pair it with another quality tournament fish.

Clint and Cameron had similar results, early in the season, the larger and heavier redfish are difficult to locate.

This event had over 160 anglers competing with 3 kayak teams entered.

The first event of the standings year will be held in June.

As a team we are having to pick and choose which of these power boat tournaments in which we participate. Entry fees are much higher for this type of event and the expenses involved in pre fishing and locating fish to remain competitive is very expensive. We will probably consolidate our efforts, enter less teams in each event, but continue to support those teams in which we are entered to locate fish and share the expense of pre fishing.
